1.0 Introduction

This statement sets out the actions to understand all potential modern slavery risks related to our business and to put in place steps that are aimed at ensuring that there is no slavery or human trafficking in the business and supply chains.

- Invoking sanctions against suppliers that fail to improve their performance in line with an action plan or seriously violate our supplier code of conduct, including the termination of the business relationship.

6.0 Assessment of Effectiveness of Actions

Brisbane Isuzu shall plan actions to address modern slavery risks; and how to:

- 1) integrate and implement the actions into operational processes or other business processes;
- 2) evaluate the effectiveness of these actions.

- What employees can do to flag up potential slavery or human trafficking issues to the relevant parties within our organisation; and
