- 3. On-Site Audits: For suppliers considered high-risk, SOLAX POWER conducts on-site audits, either with our internal audit team or through third-party auditors, to inspect working conditions, worker treatment, and compliance with our Supplier Code of Conduct.
- 4. Continuous Monitoring: We maintain ongoing monitoring of our supply chain through a combination of periodic reviews, audits, and by staying informed of changing conditions in the countries and industries from which we source.
