

MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT FY2025- UPDATE

INTRODUCTION

Montu Group Pty Ltd (Montu) remains committed to improving our practices to identify, assess, prevent, mitigate and remediate modern slavery risks. This updated Modern Slavery Statement describes the activities we have undertaken to strengthen our approach to modern slavery risk management and better understand the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our operations and supply chain.

Our Actions in FY 2025 focussed on:

1. Deepening our understanding of modern slavery risks across our global supply chain
2. Embedding modern slavery governance into procurement, operations and supplier management
3. Improving due diligence processes and supplier engagement
4. Continuing to refine our internal reporting, risk assessment and escalation procedures.

REPORTING ENTITY

This joint statement is submitted by Montu Group Pty Ltd (ABN 35 634 198 360) of Level 18, 1 Nicholson St, East Melbourne VIC 3004 (Montu) a reporting entity under the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth) with consolidated annual revenue of at least \$100 million. This joint statement covers Montu along with its subsidiary companies, Alternaleaf Australia Pty Ltd (ABN 67 649 613 005) (Alternaleaf), Leafio Australia Pty Ltd (ABN 98 672 015 011) (Leafio), and uMeds Australia Pty Ltd (ABN 71 683 182 014) (uMeds), Saged Australia Pty Ltd (ACN 693 881 891) (Saged), and Cannabis Council Australia Ltd (ACN 673 775 874).

This supplementary statement is prepared in accordance with the requirements of section 14 of the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth), and relates to the period **1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025**, which reflects a transition in the organisation's financial year to a 1 January - 31 December cycle. Future Modern Slavery statements will align with the new financial year and cover the period from 1 January to 31 December each year.

CORPORATE GROUP STRUCTURE AND OPERATIONS

Montu is a leading health tech company pioneering access to alternative healthcare through technology-enabled care, clinical education, and pharmacy solutions.

Founded in 2019, Montu supports patients and clinicians via its telehealth clinic, Alternaleaf; delivers accredited clinical education through its SAGED platform; and enables streamlined

dispensing for pharmacies nationwide via Leafio. Montu is also the founding member of Cannabis Council Australia, an independent, not-for-profit body driving informed policy reform. Through innovation and collaboration, Montu is helping shape a safer, more accessible future for alternative care in Australia.

Alternaleaf is a telehealth medical consultation clinic providing patient appointments, prescribing pathways and clinical & non-clinical support for patients interested in considering medicinal cannabis as a treatment option.

uMeds is a company that connects patients to pharmacists supporting the dispensing and delivery of medicinal cannabis products that the patient requires for their treatment.

Leafio and Saged have been established as subsidiary companies and, during the last financial year, did not have an operational business.

Across the Group, Montu employs 649 employees and 93 contractors as at 31 December 2025.

Montu Group's operations include:

- Managing long term supply agreements with cultivators and pharmaceutical manufacturers
- Importation, warehousing, repackaging (via contract packers) and distribution of medicinal cannabis products
- Operation of a nationwide telehealth clinic and related support services
- Partnerships with pharmacies and logistics providers to ensure the safe delivery of medicinal cannabis to authorised recipients

Montu's operations are based in Australia with a supply chain that extends internationally.

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS

Montu sources medicinal cannabis according to long-term supply agreements with Australian and overseas suppliers. In the reporting period, we had cultivator suppliers located in the following countries:

- Australia
- Canada

Montu sources suppliers of finished medicinal cannabis goods and devices in the following countries:

- Australia
- Canada
- South Africa, and
- Germany

Although smaller in spend, the broader supply chain also includes:

- Transports and logistics providers
- Contract packers
- Pharmaceutical service providers
- Telehealth technology platforms
- IT hardware and software vendors
- Corporate and professional services providers

Montu continues to mature the visibility of its lower-tier supply chain through structured due diligence and supplier engagement.

MODERN SLAVERY RISKS IN OPERATIONS AND SUPPLY CHAINS

Our approach to identifying and assessing risks of modern slavery in our business operations and supply chains includes performing on-site audits with our contract packers and cultivators, and regularly meeting supplier representatives and business owners.

These are the channels in which we are most likely to incur modern slavery risk. We are concurrently building out our systems to identify and assess risks of modern slavery in other areas of our business, and embedding our risk management processes more generally.

Montu undertakes risk assessments consistent with Attorney-General's Guidance, focussing on:

- Sector and Industry risk
- Product and service risk
- Geographic risk
- Entity-specific risk

1. Risks in Montu's Operations

Montu assessed its direct operations as low risk, due to:

- Operations located solely in Australia which has a low prevalence of modern slavery
- A predominantly professional workforce
- Strong regulatory oversight within the medicinal cannabis sector
- Direct contractual relationships with workers, supported by HR and compliance systems

2. Risks in Tier 1 Supply Chain

During the reporting period, the organisation undertook a review of its procurement arrangements and supply chain risk profile. As part of this process, the organisation successfully removed all Tier 1 Suppliers located in China and North Macedonia from its active supplier base. As at 31 December 2025, the organisation no longer maintains any direct commercial relationships with suppliers located in either of these jurisdictions.

We have assessed our supply chain participants outside Australia for their susceptibility to risks of modern slavery, as set out below. This score is calculated based upon purchase orders generated during the reporting period against estimated prevalence of modern slavery as reported in The Global Slavery Index 2023 ¹. The findings are reproduced below. (1 'The Global Slavery Index 2023' published by Walk Free accessible via [walkfree.org](https://www.walkfree.org))

Based on our assessment, 100% of our supply chain procurement by risk category represents a low risk for modern slavery. Our total procurement spend by risk category is set out below:

Montu has a policy framework that sets out our commitment to responsibly source goods and services, ensure transparency, take action to prevent, mitigate, remediate harm and comply with applicable laws. Montu's Supplier Risk Management Guidance provides a structured approach for identifying, assessing, mitigating and managing risks associated with third-party suppliers throughout the entire engagement lifecycle.

This framework is being implemented, and requires the following actions:

1. Risk Identification and Assessment

- On-site audits of contract packers and cultivators
- Structured meetings with supplier representatives and business owners to discuss labour practices and ethical sourcing
- Maintenance of a supplier risk matrix aligned with geographic and sectoral risk factors

2. Supplier Controls and Contract Requirements

Montu's procurement processes require:

- Manufacturing according to Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) standards
- Cultivators to maintain Good Agricultural and Collection Practices (GACP) certification
- Inclusion of explicit modern slavery prohibitions and audit rights in contracts
- Requirements for Australian device suppliers to conduct their own supply chain due diligence

3. Mitigation and Monitoring

- Monitor and mitigate risks within operations and supply chains
- Track supplier compliance and escalate concerns
- Conduct further investigations where risks identified

4. Remediation and Grievance Mechanisms

Montu has processes to:

- Engage collaboratively with suppliers to address breaches
- Protect whistleblowers and individuals raising concerns
- Align with the 'worker-centered remediation' principles outlined in the AGD Guidance

5. Effectiveness Assessment

Montu reviews:

- Supplier audit findings to track compliance with modern slavery standards and contractual obligations
- Preparation of risk assessments
- Trend analysis

Ongoing assessment supports improved decision-making and long term risk reduction. The organisation will continue to monitor supplier activities, conduct periodic supplier reviews and assess emerging risks to ensure that modern slavery risks remain identified, mitigated and managed appropriately.

MODERN SLAVERY GOVERNANCE AND CONSULTATION

Governance

Montu's Directors are responsible for overseeing our modern slavery risk management strategy and the overall direction of our organisation in ensuring modern slavery considerations are embedded into corporate governance. Montu's Directors have reviewed and approved this modern slavery statement.

Consultation with Controlled Entities

In accordance with s16(1)(f) Montu regularly consults with its controlled entities, Alternaleaf and uMeds, to ensure alignment with modern slavery risk assessment, policy requirements, reporting pathways and supplier engagement expectations across the group.

OUR POLICY ON SLAVERY

Montu is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery in our supply chains or in any part of our business. Our Modern Slavery Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships, to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to prevent modern slavery and ensuring supplier compliance and continuous improvement.
