■ INTRODUCTION

Modern Slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. It takes various forms, as set out below. Each of these types of Modern Slavery involve coercion, threats or deception and have in common the deprivation of a person's liberty by another in order to exploit them for personal or commercial gain;

- **Trafficking in persons** – recruitment, harbouring and movement of a person for exploitation through slavery.
- **Slavery** – the offender exercises powers of ownership over the victim, including the power to make a person an object of purchase and use their labour in an unrestricted way.
- **Servitude** – the victim's personal freedom is significantly restricted and they are not free to stop working or leave their place of work.
- **Forced labour** – the victim is either not free to stop working or not free to leave their place of work.
- **Forced marriage** – Coercion, threats or deception are used to make a victim marry or where the victim does not understand or is incapable of understanding the nature and effect of the marriage ceremony.
- **Debt bondage** – Victim's services are pledged as security for a debt and the debt is manifestly excessive or the victim's services are not applied to liquidate the debt, or the length and nature of the services are not limited and defined
- **Child labour** – Where children are:
 - Exploited through slavery or similar practices, including for sexual exploitation; or
 - Engaged in hazardous work which may harm their health, safety or morals; or
 - Used to produce or traffic drugs.

*The worst forms of child labour can occur in a variety of contexts and industries. This may include orphanage trafficking and slavery in residential care institutions, as well as child labour in factories and manufacturing sites, mining and agriculture
- **Deceptive recruiting for labour or services** – the victim is deceived about whether they will be exploited through a type of Modern Slavery.

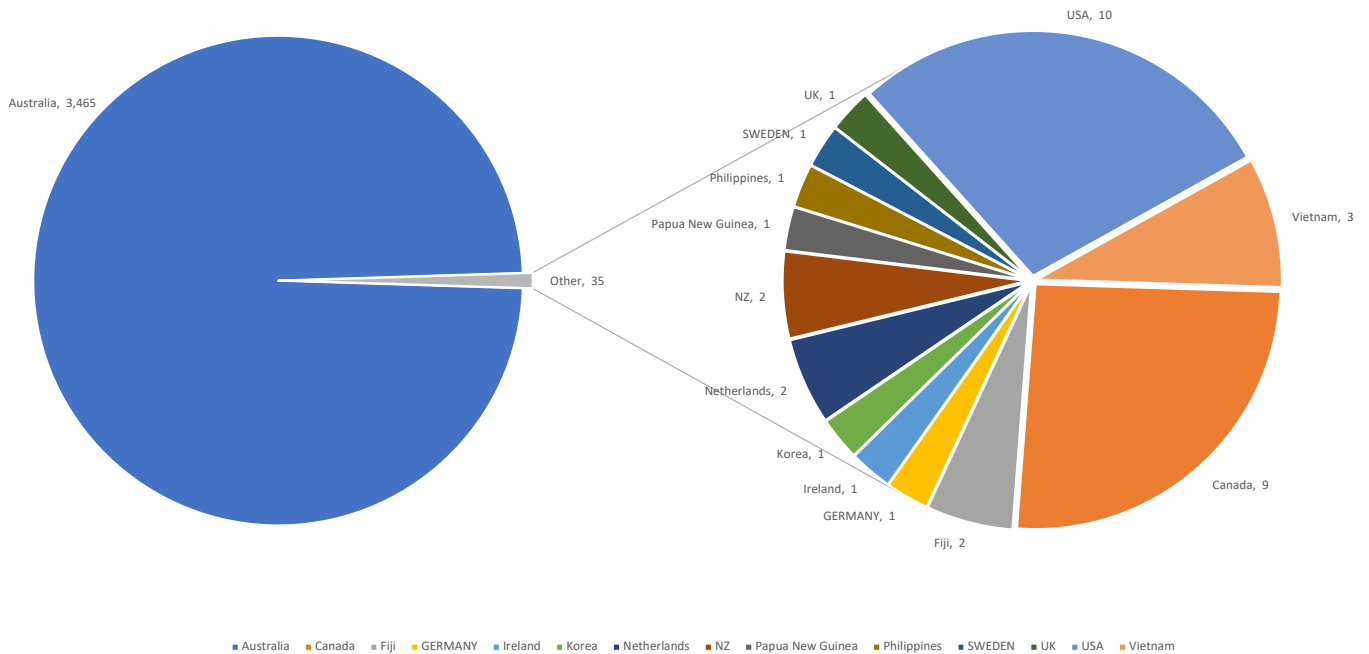

OUR SUPPLY CHAIN

Ahrens supply chain is wide ranging and complex across many countries. During the reporting period we engaged approximately 3,500 suppliers of products and services. The vast majority of our direct suppliers (99%) are based in Australia with the remainder from other countries as shown below;

Despite the complexity of our large and diverse supply chains, Ahrens are committed to continually improving how we work to meet our moral and ethical obligation to combat modern slavery. We expect all of our subcontractors and suppliers to comply with all legislative obligations and to mitigate the risk of Modern Slavery.

Our supply chain includes, but is not limited to;

Products provided to Ahrens by suppliers

- Materials and components for direct fabrication or manufacture by Ahrens (eg: Structural Steel, Metal sheeting)
- Company clothing
- Construction Plant and equipment
- IT equipment

Services provided by suppliers

- Trade contractors (e.g. Processing plant assembly, Cleaning services)
- Specialist consultancy services (e.g. Design Consultancy services)
- Transport and Shipping services

Products and services used by indirect suppliers in Ahrens supply chains

- Materials (e.g. Concrete, Steel, Carpet, Mechanical equipment)
- Specialist consultancy services (e.g. Mechanical design, Acoustic design)
- Specialist Trade Contractors (e.g. Welding, Building Services Commissioning)

Our subsidiary companies have controls and these are being reviewed for potential standardisation across the Ahrens Group.

OUR MODERN SLAVERY RISKS

Ahrens follow the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights in scoping potential modern slavery risks that we may either cause, contribute to, or to which our operations may be directly linked. Our assessment has considered these risks in the context of:

- Our direct operating conditions;
- Labour conditions in connection with the materials we source; and
- Labour conditions of indirect labour used in our operations

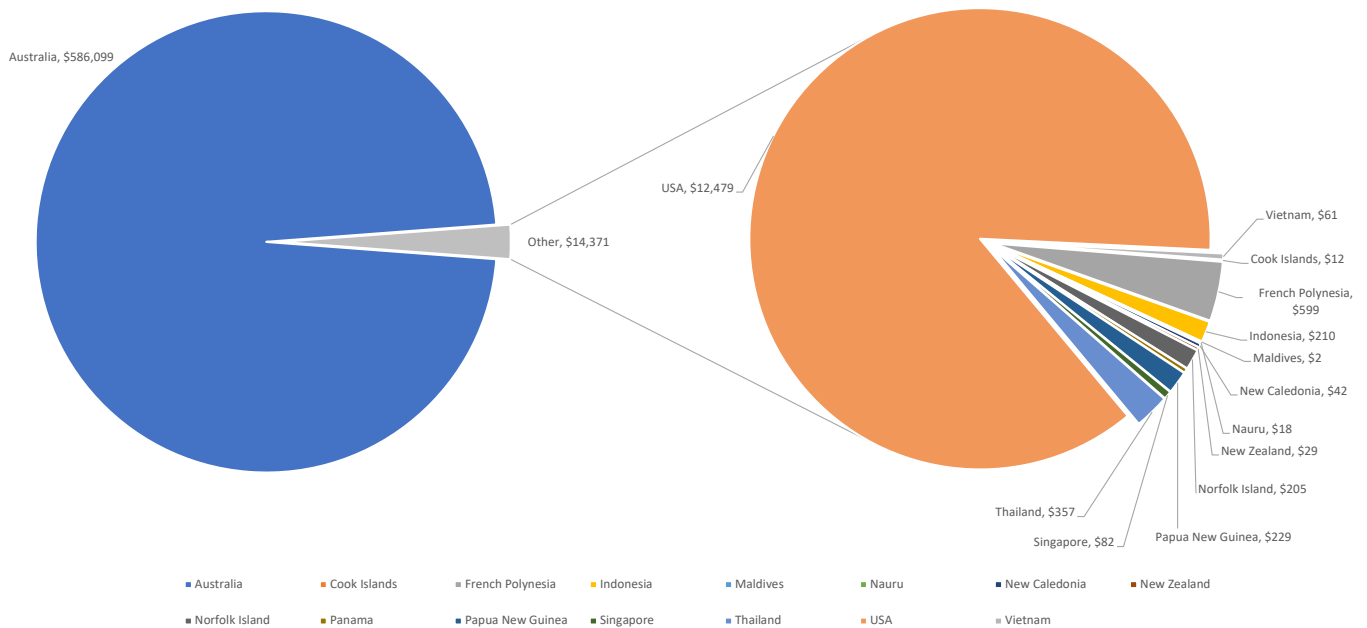
A risk assessment for each Division was undertaken in 2025 focusing on suppliers from high-risk countries or suppliers of high-risk products.

LABOUR

Whilst our operations are based in Australia, USA and Vietnam, a number of our projects are located in other countries where subcontract labour may be used for the installation and erection of assets.

The value of projects undertaken and products supplied during the reporting period in Australia and overseas is shown below with the vast majority (98%) being in Australia.

In particular our water storage operations have exported water tanks to numerous countries as shown above.

A number of these projects are located in countries where the risk of exploited labour has been assessed as high. Ahrens conducted risk assessments to mitigate the risk of modern slavery in its export operations of water tanks.

In addition, these projects require materials and componentry to be transported by ship which has been identified as having a potentially higher risk of labour exploitation.

MATERIALS

The Global Slavery Index identifies that sourcing supplies from countries such as China (light fixtures, office machine parts, telephones, rubber footwear), India (potentially used minerals, machinery and mechanical appliances) have an increased risk of modern slavery in supply chains.

Components of building products which are linked to increased risk of modern slavery include cobalt, granite, rubber, cement, and copper.

Ahrens purchase a number of materials directly for our operations such as metal sheeting, structural steel and concrete whilst other materials are obtained through our supply chain (eg/mechanical equipment, carpets, paint etc). The source materials for these and the manufacture of the products may present a higher risk of Modern Slavery depending on the source or manufacturing location. The shipping of these materials to our operations

or projects may also present a higher risk.

In addition, Ahrens owns and maintains a multi-million dollar fleet of plant and equipment. Whilst new plant and parts are purchased through dealerships, Ahrens have little or no visibility of the supply chain involved in the manufacture of such plant and equipment.

Similarly Ahrens purchase a large amount of company clothing and personal protective equipment (PPE) for it's employees.

This is also conducted through retailers however Ahrens have minimal visibility as to the supply chain for materials and textiles used in the manufacture of the clothing and PPE with textile production having been identified as having a high risk of labour exploitation in some countries.

Ahrens also purchases IT equipment (computers, printers, phones etc) through retailers. We have minimal visibility into the supply chain for the source materials, component manufacture or assembly of such equipment.



■ ACTIONS TAKEN

Actions taken to address our Modern Slavery Risks.

OUR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Ahrens are committed to having a positive and meaningful impact on the communities in which we operate. We aim to empower our people and the wider community to be an active part of supporting a brighter future for all.

Driven by our mission to challenge for better and advocate for change, Ahrens have identified and developed key initiatives to support and fund, to guide us in achieving our goal of building a better global community.

The mitigation of Modern Slavery risk is a key component of our overall business and operation risk management framework.

DUE DILIGENCE ACTIONS

During the reporting period our focus has been on establishing a solid base and framework for the assessment and management of our Modern Slavery Risks.

During the reporting period, the following actions were undertaken;

- Supply chain processes were reviewed and relevant documents revised to incorporate Modern Slavery information, Ahrens expectations and Supplier obligations. These have been deployed and communicated to our supply chain

- Our Whistleblower processes have been revised to ensure that protections are available to those who report actual or suspected Modern Slavery practices
- Our training and induction processes have continued to ensure new employees in particular are aware of Modern Slavery and reporting processes.
- A modern Slavery Protection procedure has been implemented to aid in prevention, identification and increase responsiveness to risks of modern slavery within our operations and supply chains.

BY ENTITIES OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY AHRENS

Ahrens undertook the above actions to address the risks of Modern Slavery in our operations and supply chains.

These actions were undertaken by the Ahrens group and as such covered the entities owned or controlled by Ahrens.

REMEDIATION ACTIONS

There were no instances of actual or suspected Modern Slavery reported to Ahrens during the financial year. As such no remedial actions were required to be initiated.



■ HOW WE ASSESS

How we assess the effectiveness of actions taken.

At this stage of development of our Governance structures for the management of our Modern Slavery Risks, the primary method of assessing the effectiveness of actions taken is through regular Senior Executive Meetings which are chaired by the Ahrens Managing Director. These are normally held monthly.

Members of the Executive Committee include the Manager of the following Divisions;

- Design & Construction
- Rural
- Mining Services
- Water Storage

This provides a mechanism for the actions taken by each entity owned or controlled by Ahrens to be assessed as all of these entities form part of the above Divisions.

Input into this assessment have included;

- A review of the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act 2018
- A review of the status of our Modern Slavery Action plan
- Feedback from our Employees, supply chain and business partners

As our Modern Slavery strategy develops this process will be continually improved through the addition of further contributing factors into the assessment.

CONSULTATION WITH OUR SUBSIDIARIES

Similarly, consultation with entities owned or controlled by Ahrens regarding the development of this statement occurred in the Senior Executive Committee meetings described above.

This included the distribution of the draft report for review and comment by each Division.

STATEMENT APPROVAL

This statement has been reviewed and was approved by the Ahrens Board of Directors on December 20, 2025.
