The Group has implemented several risk management initiatives in managing modern slavery risks :-


- **Staff employed** by the group are paid above the minimum wage. The Group has the Employment Code of Practice to ensure a respectful and lawful workplace
- **Fuel Importation** : fuel is supplied by well-respected international fuel majors, majority of which are listed on major international stock exchanges and operating to high ethical standards
- Fuel Transport : fuel transport is contracted out to well-known and respected Australian transport companies
- Shared Services : we currently have staff members in our Adelaide office, all employed at the above market wage conditions
- **IT Services** are contracted out to well-known Australia IT consultancy companies
- Other procurement and the associated risks are set out below :-
 - Safety equipment and uniforms; reputable Australian suppliers ; and
 - Stationery and office supplies : reputable Australian suppliers
- In our **contractual arrangements**, we reserve the right to terminate any contractual agreement or partnership if there is a breach of our Modern Slavery Statement

[•] We have benchmarked modern slavery risk based on where we operate via the Prevalence score index

- Under the Global Slavery Index (as at 2024), our operations are in Singapore and in Australia are considered low-risk countries based on prevalence scores of 1.6 (Australia) and 2.1 (Singapore) ⁽¹⁾
- We have assessed our risk as "Low" and notwithstanding the same, have embarked on initiatives to mitigate and reduce Moden Slavery risks

2024 Initiatives

Implemented in FY2024

Supply Chain

- Supplier due diligence (KYC) and vendor risk assessments as part of the vendor selection process
- Inclusion of modern slavery clauses in buy-sell contracts, new supplier forms and purchase orders
- Continuous and conscious strategy and decision to purchase fuel supply from globally recognized and wellknown companies

Operations

- The establishment of a new central procurement function which provides independent purchasing, improved vendor assessments and procurement governance
- The establishment of Group Contracting Policy that outlines responsibilities from contract owner to Director and the guiding principles in contracting excellence

Training

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Training and awareness for new employees and specific staff responsible for procurement activities within the business

Effectiveness of Initiatives





- During this reporting period, our focus was to continue to establish the relevant groundwork and foundations to ensure the organization has a better understanding and appreciation of modern slavery risks within our operations and supply chain
- IORT Group is always consistently reviewing its existing processes and have included a process of contracting with globally recognized and well-known fuel services providers
- By adopting this approach of fuel purchasing and imports, the Group can manage risks of modern slavery effectively and eliminate any risks of modern slavery in its value chain

Consultation with reporting entities



- The IORT Group Board of Directors have ultimate responsibility for governance and oversight of modern slavery risks and all reporting entities (in Table 1) are controlled and operated through a single management team
- All reporting entities within the Group are bound by IORT's Groups policies and procedures including the adherence to the Code of Conduct and Modern Slavery Policy and made aware of the available reporting mechanisms (Whistleblowing Hotline, Line Manager / +1)
- As mentioned in our initiatives section, training and awareness sessions were held for all new employees within the IORT Group to ensure that modern slavery awareness are developed from the grassroot level onwards and permeates throughout the organization

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Summary

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- The IORT Group is an independent fuel supply entity operating in Australia with a representative office in Singapore
- > The risk of modern slavery practices in the Group has been identified as "low-risk"
- The Group will continue its plans to identify, reduce, mitigate and eradicate any modern slavery practices within its operations and supply chains
