Introduction

Intellihub is committed to conducting business responsibly and ethically. We recognise that modern slavery and human trafficking are significant global issues that affect millions of people and undermine fundamental human rights. As part of our commitment, we strive to ensure that our operations and supply chains are free from any form of forced labour, servitude, or exploitation.

This statement outlines the steps we have taken and continue to take to identify, prevent, and address risks of modern slavery within our business and supply chain

The Intellihub business

Structure

The Intellihub Group is made up of privately held Australian and New Zealand companies, employing over 430 people across offices in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Auckland, and Tauranga.

Operations

The Intellihub Group is a utility services company that delivers innovative metering and data solutions to maximise digital and new energy services.

We are an experienced and leading provider of multi-utility services for residential, commercial & industrial, embedded network and solar metering customers. Our core business is the installation, operation, and maintenance of smart electricity meters.

We are rapidly growing our behind the meter business and are working with a range of stakeholders to help households and businesses better optimise electricity consumption. This includes the electrical load from household energy appliances such as solar, batteries, water heating, electric vehicle charging, pool pumps and other household appliances. Through our cloud-based Distributed Energy Resource (DER) software we provide the control and data management required for virtual power plant participation.

Consultation

As part of preparing this statement, we consulted with executive leaders and directors for the reporting entities within the Intellihub Group who have reviewed and approved the content.

Our consultation included review by the directors of our subsidiary companies both within Australia and in New Zealand. All our subsidiaries are required to follow the same policies and processes despite not being reporting entities or, in the case of our New Zealand subsidiary, not directly being subject to the Australian Modern Slavery legislation.

In addition, this statement has been approved by the Board of Directors of Spark Investment Holdco Pty Ltd as the parent entity for the Intellihub Group and its reporting entities.

Governance

We are committed to embedding human rights considerations into decision-making, our policies and governance framework. Members of executive leadership formally review and approve Intellihub policies.

Our executive leaders were also involved in creating and endorsing our ESG Framework, which we have recently reviewed and updated. The ESG Framework provides the basis for ongoing efforts to meet our commitments to partner and work with our suppliers to combat modern slavery and human trafficking and improve working conditions.


Assessing our risk

Summary

We have assessed the risk of modern slavery of our Tier 1 suppliers. The assessment found that the majority of our Tier 1 suppliers (73.8%) have a low risk of modern slavery.

We have identified that eleven companies in our Tier 1 supply chain (representing 26.29% of our Tier 1 suppliers) have a medium risk of modern slavery with partial risk controls in place. In FY 2026, we are working with these suppliers to increase their risk controls to mitigate the risks of modern slavery to a low level.

From our assessment we do not consider any of our Tier 1 suppliers present a high risk of modern slavery.

Our assessment methodology

We have engaged a third party to help us conduct a detailed assessment of the risks of modern slavery in our supply chain.

The assessment has been conducted in line with the Social Responsibility Alliance’s Slavery & Trafficking Risk Template. This is a global standard for assessing modern slavery risks.

The assessment included an examination of the risks inherent to a supplier’s operations, and the risk that remains after accounting for modern slavery risk controls that have been implemented.

As of the date of this Statement, we have assessed our Tier 1 suppliers' risks of modern slavery. Our Tier 1 suppliers are defined with reference to our annual expenditure along with their importance to our business.

In FY 2026, we will continue assessing our other suppliers against this framework.

Inherent risks

We have determined each of our Tier 1 suppliers' inherent risk by asking which countries, regions, sectors and high-risk goods are part of their operations, production or supply chain.

Countries of operation

Our supply chains include major global suppliers with operations around the world, including manufacturing locations in Indonesia, China and Malaysia.

As part of our risk assessment, we have considered whether the countries where our suppliers operate fully meet the U.S Trafficking Victims Protection Act's (TVPA) minimum standards. The TVPA minimum standards are minimum standards for the elimination of trafficking that are applicable to the country of origin, transit, or destination.

Our risk assessment found that some of our Tier 1 suppliers do have operations in countries which have not fully met the TVPA minimum standards.

Sectors of operation

As part of providing our customers with metering services and data solutions, our supply chain includes suppliers spanning the following major spending categories:

- ◆ Smart metering and communications devices, and associated equipment which we primarily own and install, allowing us to provide metering services to our customers who are overwhelmingly electricity retail businesses.
- ◆ Smart metering device installation, and maintenance services, provided by qualified electrical field service technicians.
- ◆ Software, data, mobile connectivity, telecommunications, and other information technology services enabling our technology platform and allowing us to provide metering and other data services to our customers.
- ◆ General operations and corporate services, including freight/shipping, legal services, insurance, office information technology and support.

As part of our risk assessment, we have considered whether the sectors where our supply chain operate, produce and/or source goods in one or more of the sectors identified in the Global Estimates of Modern Slavery as a sector with a high risk of forced labour exploitation. The Global Estimates of Modern Slavery is a report prepared by the International Labour Organisation, Walk Free and the International Organisation for Migration that estimates the number of people in situations of modern slavery.

Our risk assessment found that the majority of our Tier 1 supply chain operate, produce and/or source goods in a sector with a high risk of forced labour exploitation. The sectors identified include manufacturing, retail, transportation and storage, and wholesale.

As a company that purchases a large volume of smart metering and communication devices, we consider that the main modern slavery risk in our supply chain comes from exposure to product manufacturing supply chains. Accordingly, it is important that our Tier 1 suppliers have adequate controls in place to mitigate and manage this risk.

Risk controls

The assessment also included an examination of the risk controls (including policies, processes, and procedures) each of our Tier 1 suppliers have in place to mitigate and manage their inherent risks, including:

- ◆ Implementation of a modern slavery screening and evaluation
- ◆ Implementation of a modern slavery vulnerability assessment
- ◆ Implementation of a policy prohibiting charging recruitment fees

- ◆ Undertaking modern slavery risk mitigation training
- ◆ Issuing modern slavery policies to suppliers

For each Tier 1 supplier the assessment considered whether inadequate, partial or adequate risk controls are in place to manage modern slavery risks.

The assessment found that we do not have any companies in our Tier 1 supply chain that have inadequate risk controls in place. The majority of our Tier 1 suppliers (73.81%) have adequate risk controls. Eleven suppliers, representing 26.19% of the Tier 1 supply chain, have partial risk controls.

Each of our Tier 1 suppliers has been given an action plan that contains additional risk controls that can be considered. If implemented, these risk controls will further reduce the risk of modern slavery.

We are working with our suppliers that have been identified as having partial risk controls to support them implement the additional risk controls in their action plans.

Our actions

Our modern slavery policies

Our policies communicate the Intellihub Group's values and expectations, setting standards for ourselves and our partners while making clear that we do not tolerate modern slavery. These policies demonstrate our strong stance against modern slavery and include our:

- ◆ Environmental Social Governance (ESG) Framework
- ◆ Modern Slavery Policy
- ◆ Code of Conduct
- ◆ Whistle-Blower Policy
- ◆ Ethical Sourcing Supplier Code of Conduct

Our ESG Framework sets out our goals and commitments in relation to combatting modern slavery and gives us a pathway forward to follow which supports and requires responsible sourcing, a safer workplace, helps drive zero emissions and enables each of us and everyone involved in our operations and supply chain to thrive.

In particular, our ESG Framework directly addresses modern slavery under the Responsible Sourcing pillar. Our ambition is to ensure we are partnering for social impact across our value chain, with specific targets and actions, including:

- ◆ Updating our Procurement Policy to incorporate ethical sourcing considerations.
- ◆ Identifying modern slavery risks within our supply chain and implementing actions to mitigate the risk.
- ◆ Providing ongoing training to our employees to recognise the signs of modern slavery and know how to effectively respond if confronted with a suspected modern slavery issue.

Our Modern Slavery Policy contains a set of principles, requirements and processes that govern how we mitigate the risk of modern slavery in business. In FY2026 we will review the Policy to ensure the principles, requirements and processes reflect our current business structure and are fit for purpose to address the modern slavery risks of our current operations and supply chain.

Our Code of Conduct, which, amongst other things specifically addresses Modern Slavery. It is publicly available on our website and to our employees via our intranet.

Our Ethical Sourcing Supplier Code of Conduct sets clear expectations for all suppliers of the Intellihub Group with respect to ethical sourcing and responsible business conduct. We are committed to upholding human rights, promoting safe and fair labour practices, reducing environmental impact, and ensuring transparency throughout our supply chain. This policy outlines the minimum standards we require our suppliers to meet and maintain our contracting policies

As part of our ongoing efforts to address the risks of modern slavery in our supply chain, we are committed

to ensuring that appropriate contractual protections and obligations are included in new supply and procurement agreements.

This includes ensuring our supply and procurement agreements incorporate drafting requiring our suppliers comply with all relevant modern slavery laws and provide assurances around their practices and our expectations. Our robust provisions and protections ensure accountability and compliance around modern slavery, including:

- ◆ Taking reasonable steps to identify, assess and address risks of modern slavery practices in the operations and supply chains used (including any third party), and
- ◆ Assurances that no form of forced, compulsory or slave labour is used.

In addition to the above controls, where we identify non-compliance with modern slavery obligations by our suppliers, we have internal documents and guidelines setting out further investigation assessment questions for vendors and remediation guidance.

Training

We provide ongoing training to our employees to recognise the signs of modern slavery and know how to effectively respond if confronted with a suspected modern slavery issue. In FY 2025 reporting period 100% of employees received modern slavery training.

Tracking our performance

We are monitoring the effectiveness of our processes and procedures to address the modern slavery risks of our business.

We will continually assess the effectiveness of our actions in identifying and managing modern slavery risks by tracking our actions and outcomes, partnering with suppliers and other external partners, and undertaking regular internal governance and external assurance processes.

Based on the results of these processes we will adapt and strengthen our actions to continually improve our response to modern slavery.
