Modern Slavery Statement 2020

The Reporting Entity

Eastcoast Automotive (Qld) Pty Ltd, ACN 162 382 050 ("the Company") provides its first Modern Slavery Statement which outlines the steps we have taken, and intend to take, to identify, manage and mitigate the specific risks of modern slavery in our operations and supply chain.

Structure, Operations and Supply Chains

The company is a stand alone company that operates from two sites in Queensland, one being in Daisy Hill, and the other Southport. The company is a franchised motor dealer selling BMW and Mini branded vehicles.

Our personnel are engaged via a services company, which has provided a declaration to us for the purposes of the Modern Slavery Act.

Supply Chains

As a franchised motor dealer, we source our motor vehicles, and the majority of our parts from the Australian based importer, BMW Australia Ltd, ACN 004 675 129. They, in turn, source these vehicles and parts from the Bayerische Motoren Werke (BMW) AG supply chain, headquartered in Germany.

Trade suppliers are located in Australia from which products are sourced to enable the company to undertake and support its normal business operations.

The Risks of Modern Slavery Practices

The company's operations predominately involve the procurement of new and used motor vehicles, as well as the servicing of these vehicles. We have not identified any of the elements of modern slavery within our operations, or immediate suppliers. However, it is considered reasonable that there may well be risks in raw material extraction and manufacturing processes, for which we do not have visibility.

Actions taken to address and remediating risks of Modern Slavery

We have undertaken an internal review of our company's internal risk of modern slavery and identified our major suppliers.

Over the next 12 months, the company expects to open communication with our suppliers as a way of minimising the potential risks of modern slavery in our supply train.

Assessment of the effectiveness of actions taken to assess and address modern slavery risks

The company intends to regularly review our response to modern slavery, together with working with suppliers to check progress. Discussions will take place with key personnel to highlight and mitigate any potential risks as new suppliers are brought on board.
