Our Business

We are a Queensland, Australia-based global online Procurement education provider, delivering unique Procurement-related skills training to organisations and individuals in Australasia, Africa, the Middle East and the Pacific Islands.

Our Core Values

Our School has three Core Values:

We have a particular focus on developing countries that have a deficit of capable skilled Procurement staff in both government and the private sector. Our training is designed to give our Students proficiency in both strategic and tactical capability. 3. Our teaching promotes Social Justice to make the World fairer.


