# Modern Slavery Statement

This statement is prepared in accordance with Section 16(1) of the Australian Modern Slavery Act 2018. It outlines the steps taken by Jayco Corporation Pty Ltd as Trustee for Jayco Unit Trust (ABN: 79 301 936 497) and its associated fiberglass supplier, Tricomposite Pty Ltd (ABN: 54 153 650 901), to assess, identify, and address risks of modern slavery within our operations and supply chains.

We remain committed to promoting ethical practices, ensuring the integrity of our business, and safeguarding human rights across all areas of our operations. At Jayco, our core values—Progress, Aligned, Respect, and Trust (PART)—form the foundation of our interactions, both within the organization and with third parties. These values inherently reflect our firm stance against human rights violations and modern slavery.

We are committed to identifying, mitigating, and addressing the risks of modern slavery within our operations and supply chains. Our approach ensures that all business activities are conducted ethically, professionally, and in compliance with legal standards, emphasizing fairness, honesty, and transparency.

We acknowledge that modern slavery can manifest in various forms, including servitude, forced or compulsory labor, and human trafficking. Recognizing this, we remain dedicated to continuous improvement. We actively engage with our supply chain partners to identify and address any risks and strive to eliminate all forms of modern slavery within our supplier network.

- Jayco manufactures its products in Australia, distributing them both locally and internationally, including to New Zealand. Our supply chain consists of approximately 283 active supply partners for direct materials, with 63 of these suppliers accounting for over 90% of our 2024/25 financial year purchases.
- To assess and mitigate the risks of modern slavery, we have engaged all suppliers and applied a risk rating based on their primary manufacturing or sourcing location. By region, our Australian supplier base represents approximately 32% of our total spend, making it our largest spend category.
- We acknowledge that Australian suppliers often operate within complex supply networks. To better understand and address potential risks, we have requested that these partners disclose the source countries of the products supplied to Jayco. This information enables us to evaluate and allocate risk more effectively within our supply chain, ensuring alignment with our commitment to ethical and responsible business practices.

# SUPPLY CHAIN RISK OVERVIEW



- Jayco recognizes that the scale and complexity of our business and supply chain make it challenging to identify all potential modern slavery risks. To address this, we focus on our Tier 1 suppliers, who collectively account for over 90% of our annual purchases. By engaging with these key suppliers, we aim to better understand and identify risks within their networks.
- Our risk assessment and audit processes are prioritized based on an internationally recognized risk and vulnerability rating, applied to the source country of each supplier. Key categories and commodities sourced for our manufacturing processes include timber, steel, aluminum, plastics, fiberglass, and chemicals.
- As part of our response to modern slavery, Jayco has undertaken internal consultations and worked closely with its associated fiberglass supplier, Tricomposite Pty Ltd. This collaboration has included completing an internal modern slavery audit and appointing a dedicated Modern Slavery Business Representative to lead and enhance our efforts in addressing modern slavery risks.



## COUNTRY OF ORIGIN



- The vast majority of our purchased goods are sourced from 63 suppliers making up over 90% of our spend, with 26 based in Australia, followed by China with 15 suppliers, Italy with 5, Germany with 5 and Indonesia with 1.
- The remaining suppliers are distributed as follows: the UK with 3, USA with 2, Thailand with 2, India, Taiwan, Malaysia, South Korea with 1 each.
- At Jayco, we not only consider the country where the supplier operates but also take a deeper look into their supply chain to understand where their products are sourced and manufactured.
- Based on our FY24/25 spend, we determined that Australian-sourced products made up 31.7%, China 30.6%, Germany 11.6% and Italy 11.5%, , with the remaining countries of origin each representing a smaller percentage of spend.
- We continue to work with our supply partners to improve the accuracy of our country-of-origin data for future reporting periods to better understand the risks of modern slavery.



## MANAGING MODERN SLAVERY RISKS



- As part of our commitment to mitigating the risks of modern slavery, Jayco continues to maintain and implement robust internal policies and procedures that reflect our firm stance on this issue.
- Our conditions of tendering, as well as our standard contract terms and conditions, explicitly require suppliers to ensure they do not knowingly contribute—either directly or indirectly—to any form of modern slavery.
- To better understand and assess the maturity of our suppliers' modern slavery risk mitigation strategies, we have engaged the top 90% of our supplier base by requesting they complete our Modern Slavery Supplier Self-Assessment Questionnaire. This assessment focuses on key areas, including:
  - Slavery and human trafficking
  - Labour standards
  - Health and safety practices
  - Anti-discrimination measures
  - Business ethics
  - Environmental responsibility
- These efforts reflect our ongoing commitment to working collaboratively with our supply chain partners to identify, address, and mitigate risks associated with modern slavery.



# ACCOUNTABILITY

- Jayco's Board and senior management have been briefed on the actions being undertaken by Jayco's Modern Slavery Working Group.
- Employee Training will continue including an awareness communication program involving Marketing and Communications.



- We have received feedback from 83 of responders out of the 100 suppliers invited to complete our Modern Slavery Supplier Self-Assessment, or that can demonstrate that they have a Current Modern Slavery statement. Our aim is to continuously work with our suppliers to ensure they meet the compliance level with the aim of improving their rating.

# Commitment to Continuous Improvement



While the actions undertaken to date provide a strong foundation for identifying and addressing modern slavery risks, we recognise that modern slavery is a complex and evolving issue and that continuous improvement is required. We remain committed to strengthening our approach to preventing, mitigating, and addressing risks of modern slavery within our operations and supply chains through enhanced due diligence and risk management practices.

During the next reporting period, we will continue to focus on strengthening supply chain accountability through the following initiatives:

- **Supplier Management Framework:** Further developing a supplier management framework that embeds ethical sourcing principles and clearly defines expectations regarding labour standards, human rights, and compliance with applicable laws.
- **Supplier Audits and Remediation:** Conducting targeted audits of higher-risk suppliers and implementing remediation actions where potential or actual risks are identified.
- **Expanded Supplier Risk Coverage:** Progressing towards 100% engagement and risk assessment coverage of suppliers assessed as medium or high risk.
- **Training and Capability Building:** Enhancing training for our Procurement and relevant operational teams to improve awareness of modern slavery risks and strengthen their ability to identify, escalate, and respond to potential issues effectively.

These initiatives demonstrate our ongoing commitment to continuous improvement and to combatting modern slavery in all its forms across our business operations and supply chains.
