Reporting entity

TRILITY's core business is delivery of water, wastewater and environmental services. TRILITY is involved in the delivery of 100s of water infrastructure projects, currently servicing over 600 facilities. Our solutions are built on our heritage and our expertise, a dedication to do it right, and a passionate commitment to provide our services effectively, efficiently, safely and responsibly.

We work alongside our partners in optimising their facilities, processes and performance – creating value through the full water and wastewater cycle, enhancing their competitiveness and protecting the environment. Our approach and design principles to water management and environmental solutions use our experience, innovation and proven technology to develop a solution to suit each client's needs.

TRILITY plays a vital role in our modern world by providing water, wastewater and environmental solutions which contribute to a better quality of life for those communities we serve, across Australia and New Zealand. We have extensive operations, spanning from the far south of Tasmania to the most northern tip of the country and across the Tasman.

TRILITY has operated in Australia since 1993 and New Zealand since 2015. Previously known as United Utilities, we have a 25-year track record of delivering significant water infrastructure projects and successfully operating them for our clients. Some of our projects have included finance, design, construction, operations and maintenance as a complete service offering, making us a leader of DBFO / BOOT project delivery of water infrastructure. We have designed, built and / or operate over 70 treatment plants in Australia and New Zealand with a combined capacity of 1,800 megalitres per day through our national workforce of approximately 300 people. These plants fall under 21 operating contracts incorporating DBFO, BOOT, DBO, D&C and O&M contract models. Several of these contracts have included financing of the project.

We have extensive operations, spanning from the far south of Tasmania to the most northern tip of the Australia and throughout New Zealand. Our business combines many services, solutions, products and applications to suit each client's needs. We keep pace with rapidly evolving technology, markets, regulations and climate conditions. Our solutions are built on our heritage and our expertise, a dedication to do it right, and a passionate commitment to provide our services effectively, efficiently, safely and responsibly.

TRILITY is broadly a national company, with most of our operations in regional areas of Australia and New Zealand. TRILITY has offices in Adelaide (x2), Melbourne (x2), Gold Coast, NSW Central Coast, Perth, and Launceston, Mount Maunganui (x1). TRILITY also has staff permanently based at more than 40 operational locations around Australia and New Zealand.

Our approach and analysis

For the current reporting period, TRILITY used the Global Slavery Index 2018 to identify industries and geographic regions which potentially present a higher risk of exposure to modern day slavery.

All suppliers of goods or services to TRILITY in both Australia and New Zealand, regardless of value, have previously been categorised based on their industry and location.

As a result of this analysis, it was found:

- 100% of TRILITY's direct suppliers are based on low-risk geographic regions
- 3.3% of goods purchased by TRILITY are from high-risk industries (textiles and IT related equipment)

As a result of this analysis, TRILITY's direct exposure to modern slavery risks is considered low. However, TRILITY recognises that, whilst the direct exposure may be low, indirect exposure may be different due to suppliers sourcing their products from geographic regions at higher risk. As a result, further work is required in conjunction with these suppliers to fully assess that risk (refer Actions to be taken).

Actions taken to date

During the current reporting period TRILITY implemented the following actions:

- Reviewed the TRILITY Modern Slavery policy for currency
- TRILITY's high risk supplier assessment has been amended to include suitable questions regarding modern slavery risks in their respective supply chains
- Modern slavery risk awareness elements have been added to the TRILITY employee induction training
- A suitable information and training package on modern slavery has been sourced and will be delivered to key work groups throughout the 2022/23 year

Actions to be taken

During the next reporting period, TRILITY commits to assessing and implementing, where practical, the following actions:

- Make recommendations to the Boards of related entities which do not currently trigger the revenue threshold for reporting regards development of an appropriate modern slavery policy
- Targeted questionnaire to be developed for high risk TRILITY suppliers to demonstrate compliance with the Modern Slavery Act.

Assessing effectiveness of those actions

Assessing the effectiveness of TRILITY's approach to managing the risks of modern slavery is an ongoing exercise which is achieved using the same continual improvement methods embedded in TRILITY's ISO certified integrated management system including:

- Establishing and measuring appropriate key performance indicators (e.g. training completion)
- The periodic management review of TRILITY's integrated management system, including assessment of the effectiveness of all procurement processes
- Reviewing a percentage of the supplier assessments issued for responses relating to modern slavery
- Internal audits



Approval

This modern slavery statement was approved by the board of TRILITY Group Pty Ltd on 23 May 2022. The boards of other entities listed on page 4 have adopted this modern slavery statement for their operations.
