



Consultation

This Statement was developed through a consultation process across the Varley Group. A final draft of the Statement was made available to each of the reporting entities, and the majority-owned and controlled entities voluntarily reporting through this Statement, prior to lodgement and publication.

The executive team, together with key senior management team members, worked together to appropriately identify the modern slavery risks related to each entity, and to assess and address these risks if necessary. Consultation was undertaken in a cross-functional process involving the Group Chairman, Group Chief Financial Officer, Group Legal Counsel and Group People Officer, and was endorsed by all divisional CEO's.

This process included:

- Identification of the modern slavery policies utilised by all entities comprising Varley Group, ensuring they are available to all personnel employed in or engaged by those entities.
- A self-assessment questionnaire for entities and their biggest suppliers designed to support the identification of modern slavery risks and foster collaborative efforts to address these risks.
- Providing guidance on each entity's risk levels and possible action to mitigate these identified risks areas

Our broad consultation process ensures that Varley Group entities and their respective employees are aware of our commitments on modern slavery and how they can support program implementation, improve transparency, and identify areas for further due diligence.

Mergers & Acquisitions

Custom Quip Engineering was newly acquired by Varley Group during 2024, and as such were a particular focus during the consultation process.

Modern slavery risk is considered in the process of acquiring new businesses, and assessed before Varley makes an offer to acquire an entity. These new entities are all expected to adopt Varley Group policies and practices, including our Modern Slavery Statement.

Modern Slavery Risk Management

'Our Approach'

Varley Group's approach to modern slavery risk management is multifaceted, and guided by our policies and commitments. Our intention is to carry out due diligence in a systematic and consistent manner, and as a part of our everyday tasks in running our business.

Our due diligence is a continual process of identifying risks and impacts to people, taking action to address these risks and impacts, and accounting for how we respect human rights in practice.

1. Identify and assess risks

- a. Ongoing risk assessments with suppliers
- b. Conduct due diligence of potential suppliers, stakeholders and other business partners

2. Take action to address the risks

- a. Ensuring policies and procedures are continually reviewed and updated, as appropriate
- b. Complying with contractual obligations
- c. Supply chain monitoring

3. Track, analyse and communicate

- a. Reporting against Australia's Modern Slavery Act
- b. Responding to grievances and questions raised by stakeholders including customers, employees and shareholders, as and when they arise

4. Training and engagement

- a. Internal training and review for the Varley Group board, as well as those employees in the Group with buying and procurement responsibilities
- b. Training including understanding workers' rights and employer responsibilities

Modern Slavery Risk Management

'Varley Sustainability Program'

Varley Group's activities this year were centred on continual improvement and embedding of our modern slavery program into everything we do at Varley Group.

The program has been coined the 'Varley Sustainability Program', or 'VSP', which communicates the foundations of our respect for human rights principles, and are designed to ensure our operations and our suppliers protect these rights. Our policies support our commitment to upholding our ethical commitment to eliminating Modern Slavery within our society.

Policies are communicated to employees through the company intranet, email, training modules and other forms of multi-media (such as videos) on Varley Group's commitments.

The VSP comprises the following:

Modern Slavery Statement

Varley Group's Modern Slavery Statement, which is updated annually to ensure it remains relevant and achievable.

George

Our business operating system, known as George, which defines our standards, values, and expectations for how we operate as a business.

Supplier Sustainability Code

The Supplier Sustainability Code outlines our standards and business practice expectations for suppliers to align themselves with, and includes provisions for preventing forced labour practices and exploitation within our supply chain;

PreVent

Varley Group's program and training policy which governs our whistleblower and grievance mechanisms and processes, and clearly defines our investigation and escalation processes. The policy prohibits any retaliation against those that report issues of misconduct within our operations and across our supply chain.

Audit Process

Our modern slavery policy and audit process demonstrates Varley Group's position in relation to zero tolerance for any form of bribery or corruption.

Assessment of Risk of Modern Slavery

For the purposes of defining modern slavery, we refer to the Act itself which describes situations where offenders "use coercion, threats or deception to exploit victims and undermine their freedom", including human trafficking, slavery, servitude, forced marriage, forced labour, debt bondage, forced marriage and child labour.

Varley understands that modern slavery risks have the potential for our business to cause, contribute or be directly linked to modern slavery. We also recognise that the level of modern slavery risk in our supply chains is influenced by a range of factors, including geographic, industry, sector and product specific factors.

Varley Group has taken a multidimensional approach to the detection and prevention of modern slavery in our business operations and supply chain. During 2024 we have taken the following actions to strengthen our understanding and oversight of the risk of modern slavery:

Staff Training

Modern slavery awareness training has been developed for Varley Group employees. This training has been rolled out to Varley Group employees in relevant roles. There is ongoing refresher training for current employees and training for new starters.

Policies and Procedures

Varley Group's policies and procedures both inward and outward facing have been updated to incorporate modern slavery awareness, including:

- Code of Conduct
- Ethical Sourcing Guiding Principles
- Whistleblower Policy
- Conflict Minerals Policy

Reporting

Varley Group has an established Whistleblower Policy and process which ensures that both employees, suppliers, customers and others out-with the Group can raise concerns regarding serious misconduct or improper circumstances (including illegal, corrupt or other inappropriate conduct) with protection from victimisation, harassment or discriminatory treatment.

Procurement Documentation and Contracts

We have embedded modern slavery clauses into both our procurement and sale documentation and contract terms. Varley Group's current and prospective suppliers are asked to read and sign up to the Varley Group Ethical Sourcing Guiding Principles before they are accepted as a supplier. These principles incorporate modern slavery and are available on our Supplier and Contractor Hub on our website.

Remediation

Where Varley Group identifies risk of modern slavery practices in its supply chain, trading with the supplier will be suspended until Varley is satisfied that the supplier has addressed and/or eliminated the risk.

Internet

Varley Group's commitment to modern slavery prevention is included in information on our public websites for both existing and potential future suppliers.

HR and Recruitment Practices

Varley Group has established policies and procedures to avoid modern slavery in its work force. The majority of trade staff are employed under Enterprise Agreements, while professional roles are under private contracts incorporating *Fair Work Act 2009* (Cth) provisions. All staff are permitted, if they choose, to join a union.

Due to domestic recruitment challenges, some Varley Group subsidiaries have taken steps to engage a very small number of off-shore workers to assist with administration and accounts functions. In doing so, Varley Group has utilised an Australian-based resourcing contractor that is fully compliant with Australia's modern slavery legislation, and which carries out regular audits of all its suppliers and employees. This ensures that every person engaged in work for the Varley Group, regardless of their geographical location, is compensated with fair wages and works in safe and ethical environments, with zero tolerance for forced labour, child employment, human trafficking or other similar modern slavery risks.

Supply Chain Analysis

Procurement is undertaken on a divisional basis supported by a consistent organisational approach to modern slavery risk management with suppliers, with strategic systematic sourcing, supplier assessments and onboarding processes. Once onboarded, the business unit that has engaged the supplier is responsible for oversight, including management of any identified modern slavery risks.

Varley Group seeks to develop relationships with reputable, responsible suppliers that are committed to the highest standards of ethics and business conduct. We have mapped our supply chain, reviewing the geographical distribution of our 2024 spend with suppliers. 94% of Varley Group's spend was with Australian based suppliers. This figure has remained consistent since our previous modern slavery submission, which reflects the steady and reliable relationships curated with our suppliers.


Varley Group does not currently have any first tier suppliers in countries with the highest prevalence of modern slavery or highest vulnerability to modern slavery based on the Global Slavery Index (North Korea, Burundi, Eritrea, Afghanistan, the Central African Republic, Mauritania, South Sudan, Pakistan, Cambodia, Iran, Syria, Chad, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Iraq, Yemen, Somalia, Sudan or South Sudan). We do not purchase products directly listed in the Global Slavery Index as at risk for import into G20 countries (cotton, cattle, sugarcane, gold, carpets, coal, fish, rice, brazil nuts, chestnuts, cocoa and diamonds).

In light of the above, and because of the more complex nature of the products we procure, we deem our modern slavery risk to be low. We do not have a significant risk of modern slavery within our operations or our workforce. Our internal policies and procedures are designed to provide a positive, safe working environment, ensure compliance with applicable law, and respect and protect human rights. We do recognise, however that modern slavery practices exist outside the countries and commodities listed in the Global Slavery Index and that we need to address risk not only in our first tier suppliers but also in their sub-tier supply base. We are also cognisant of the ongoing increased modern slavery risks resulting from the economic and social disruption caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, which although appears to be reducing in Australia, is still a significant issue in some other countries.

In 2023, Varley Group carried out an audit of our top 200 suppliers (by spend) via our curated Modern Slavery Questionnaire. All responses were reviewed in detail through a desktop audit, and no concerns identified. Although we have not repeated this exercise during 2024, our supplier range has not significantly altered, so we do not anticipate that there would be much variation in the results. Notwithstanding these assumptions, we intend to repeat the audit during 2025 and to carry out a desktop review. This will also ensure that we have covered new suppliers brought into Varley's corporate group via acquisition.

During 2024 we have had no reports of modern slavery breaches in our supply chain.

Effectiveness of Approach

No reports or concerns about modern slavery and/or related issues have been received through Varley's reporting chains during 2024, and we have not otherwise identified any instances of modern slavery or human trafficking in our business or its supply chain. This is consistent with our assessment that overall, Varley Group's exposure to human trafficking and modern slavery is low.

Future Actions to Assess Modern Slavery Risk

Modern slavery awareness and prevention is now embedded in our corporate policies and practices. Over the next year we will continue our role in modern slavery prevention and awareness through the following actions:

- Continued staff training for new and current staff, with a goal to ensure modern slavery is a topic regularly reviewed with employees
- Incorporation of modern slavery risk evaluation in our supplier audits with a particular emphasis on our supplier sub-tiers
- A heightened awareness of the risks of modern slavery when sourcing new work and onboarding new suppliers, with the aim to do business with reputable, responsible suppliers committed to high standards of ethics and business conduct
- Continuance of the effective practices implemented over the last year
- Continued vigilance throughout our operations due to the enhanced global risk of slavery due to the economic and social disruptions of conflict overseas
- Monitor the development of new laws and regulations relating to the prevention of modern slavery and human trafficking, to ensure our policies, practices and procedures remain current and compliant
- Re-evaluate our supply base through use of our Modern Slavery Questionnaire, with a particular focus on suppliers integrated through business acquisition

We believe over the last year we have made significant steps to understand and mitigate the risk of modern slavery in our business operations. We recognize, however, that this is just the beginning of our journey and the policies and systems now embedded in our business practices must be continued and enhanced over the coming years.

Varley Group is committed to ensuring no modern slavery exists in any of our operations now and in the future.
